

About On the Road to Work



On the Road to Work is a training and employment initiative for disengaged &/or unemployed/underemployed youth from 15 – 24, with no costs to participants.

On the Road to Work with ATEP offers multi-industry ‘taster’ programs together with nationally recognised Certificate II qualification and ATEP-supported pathways into employment.

Fees, Supports and Incentives

For Australian citizens or residents, aged 15 – 24, with a concession or health care card and is unemployed or underemployed, there is no cost to do this program!

ATEP pay:

- Full TAFE fees (for concession or health care card holders only)
- Personal Protective Equipment
- Transport (via group transport) for work experience
- WorkCover
- On the Road to Work Incentive – total value of \$500 paid to participants on completion



Transportation – we’ve got you!

On the Road to Work isn’t just a name, it’s what we are doing differently!

ATEP is working with dedicated bus providers to support the work experience portion of this program with transport to and from work experience, picking youth up from a safe meeting point to get to work, and back to the meeting point at the end of the work experience shift.

Real Work Experience

An important part of On the Road to Work is work experience; with VECCI, industry stakeholders and community mentors youth get to experience firsthand working in trades. *(And perhaps meet their new boss!)*



The work experience sets this apart from other courses as this is a short term ‘employment’ with ATEP as we support your training and skill development to get you ‘On the Road to Work’ in a new career!
