Women currently represent just 8.9% of all learners in trades.

Who can apply?

- women between 16 to 24 years old
- female jobseekers (regardless of age)
- women in receipt of Commonwealth benefits
- women who are at risk of becoming unemployed and require retraining in order to secure ongoing employment.
